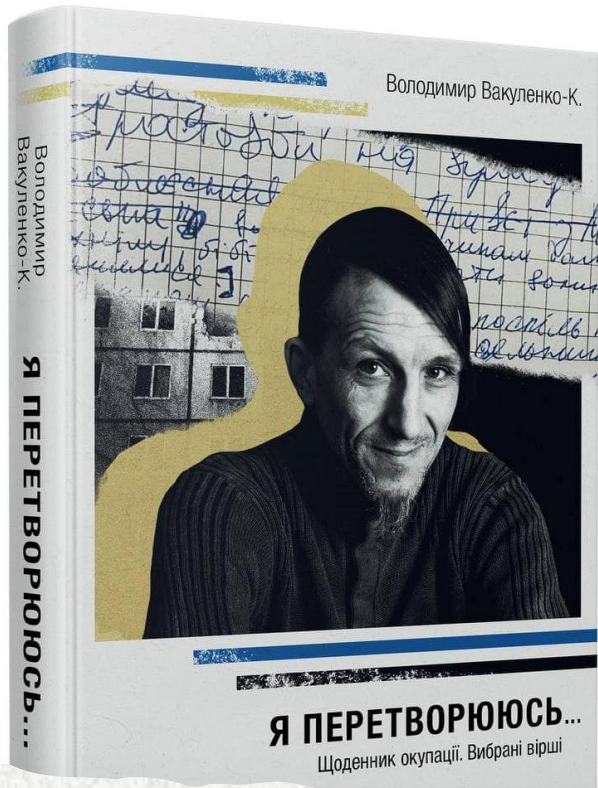
Ukrainian cultural heritage and national identity are one of the enemy's primary targets.

- During the 2 years of war, Ukraine has lost hundreds and thousands of its best people, soldiers, children, many wounded and many unborn. This is a war of two values: democracy versus authoritarianism, and the future of the entire world will depend on the outcome of the war in Ukraine.
- Now we are fighting for our culture, language and traditions, for the existence of the Ukrainian people, and libraries are at the forefront of this. When Russia occupies the territories, it first destroys our books and language, and then imports books in Russian, especially textbooks for children. For 2 years now, children in the occupied territories have been forced to learn Russian and Russian history.
- Libraries in Ukraine have their own struggle, they are actively getting rid of books in Russian that are propagandistic in nature. Libraries are becoming volunteer and humanitarian hubs. They help internally displaced Ukrainians and the army.

On April 1, 2022 Ukrainian writer, poet and public figure **Yuriy Ruf** died in the fighting in Luhansk region.



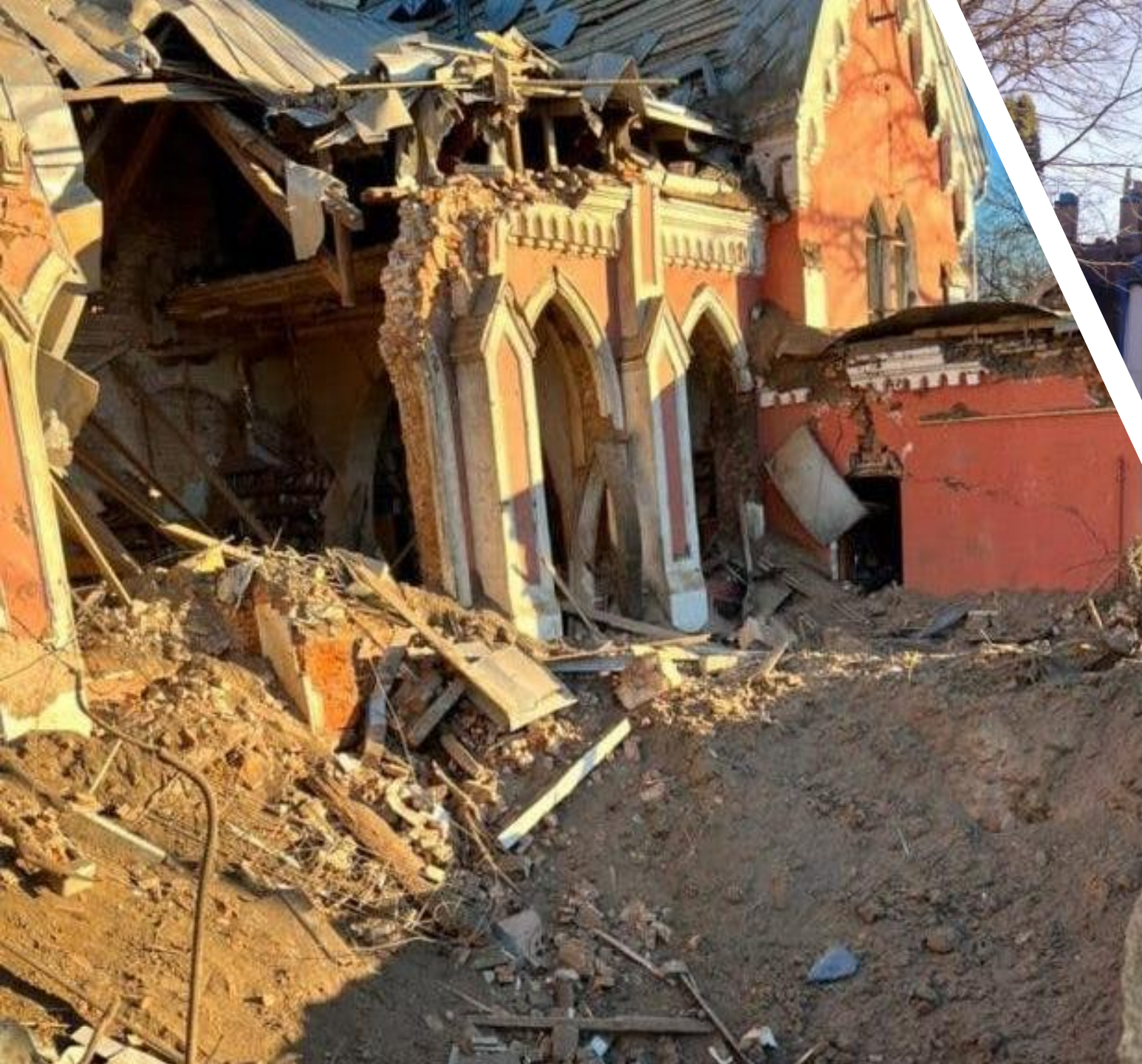
Writer **Victoria Amelina** died of injuries after the Russian attack on Kramatorsk on July 1, 2023

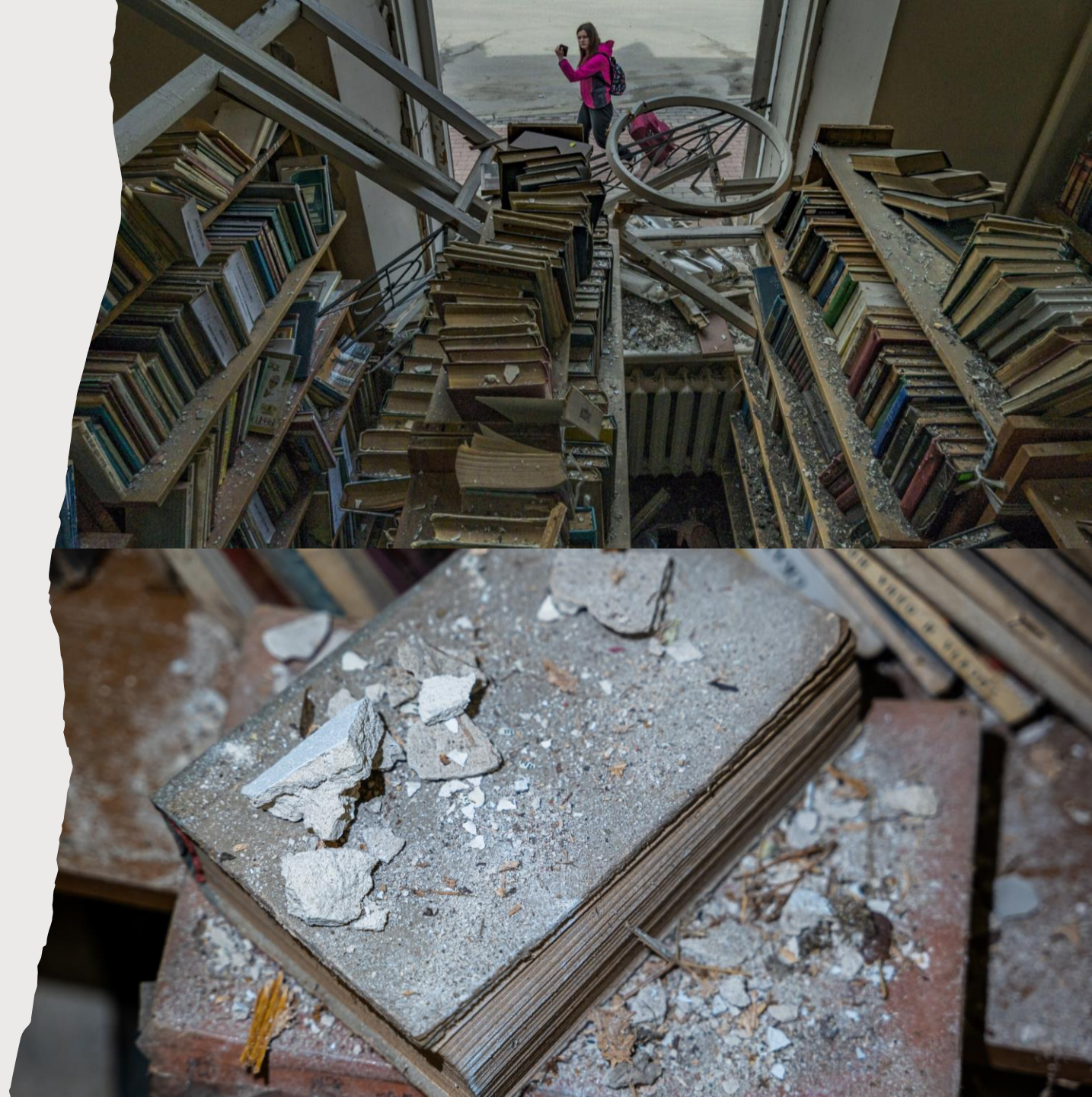

- about the Holodomor (man-made by Stalin famine of 1933 in Ukraine)





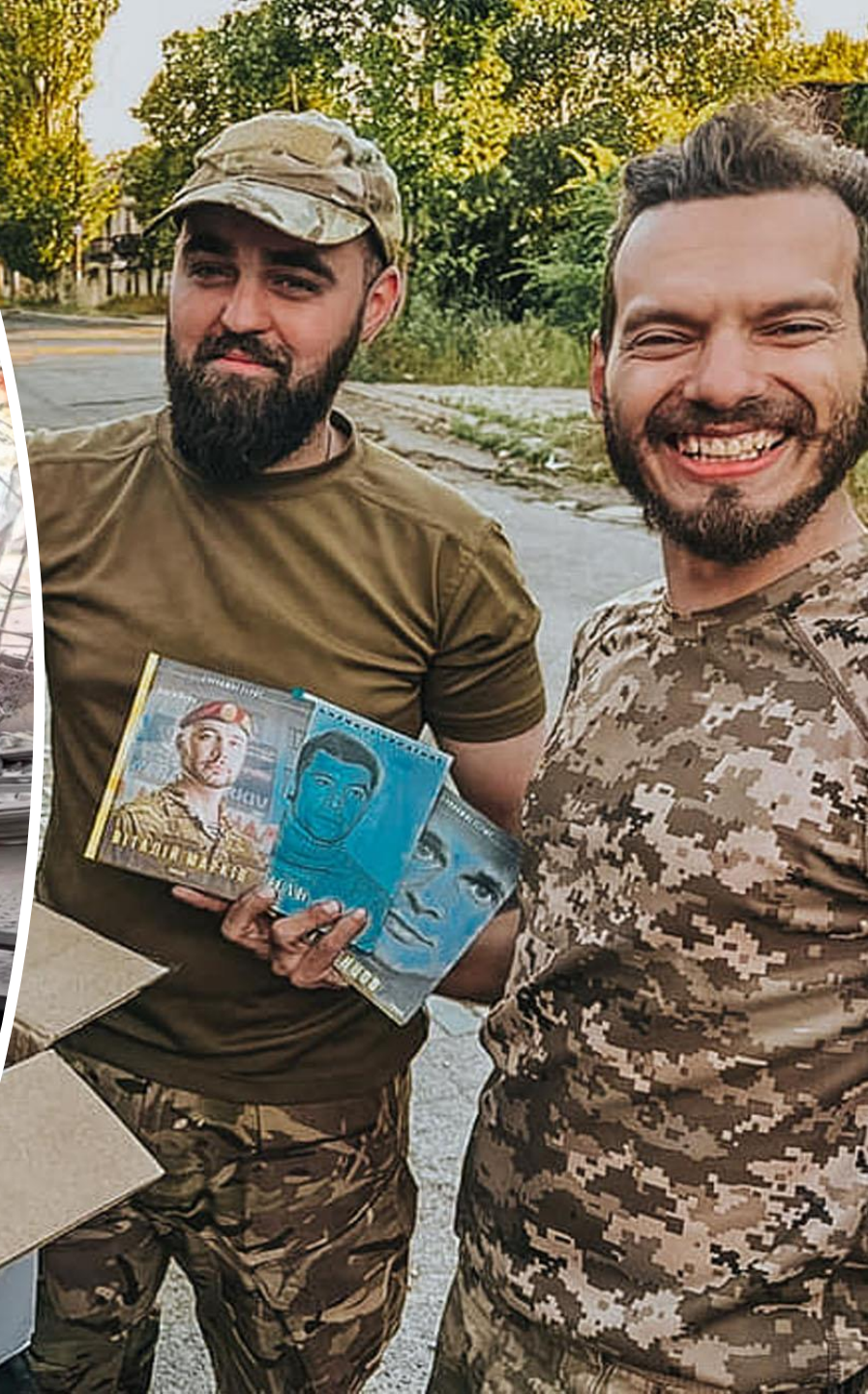
Ivankiv, Kyiv region, was occupied in March
